# RESOLUTION OF THE SISKIYOU COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS IN SUPPORT OF THE SECOND AMENDMENT AND THE RIGHT OF THE PEOPLE TO KEEP AND BEAR ARMS

WHEREAS, the Second Amendment to the United States Constitution, as part of United States Bill of Rights, ratified on December 15, 1791, protects the right of the people to keep and bear Arms; and,

WHEREAS, two landmark decisions issued by the United States Supreme Court established that the Second Amendment protects an individual's right to possess a firearm unconnected with service in a militia, and to use that Arm for traditionally lawful purposes, such as, but not limited to, self-defense within the home, and that the right could not be infringed by the federal government (District of Columbia v. Heller); and that under the Fourteenth Amendment the right to keep and bear Arms was incorporated and would also prohibit state and local governments from infringement of the right (McDonald v. City of Chicago); and,

WHEREAS, sadly, recent high profile events within our country have sparked discussions of gun-control at the local, state and federal levels and include numerous gun-control proposals that assert to address gun violence while, in fact, many of these proposals would directly infringe upon the Second Amendment rights; and,

WHEREAS, the County of Siskiyou economy and rural quality are supported by ranching, farming and natural resources, and that the right to keep and bear Arms is fundamental to our right to protect our families, our property, our livestock, and our livelihood, and that the residents of this County respect the rights afforded by the Second Amendment through the recognition and support of responsible firearm ownership, training and awareness:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Siskiyou County Board of Supervisors that the County of Siskiyou supports all discussions seeking new ideas to protect our citizens from violence but cannot abide by any provision infringing upon the Second Amendment.

### Proposed Changes to Resolution under consideration from Mike Adams

RESOLUTION NO.

OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF SISKIYOU IN SUPPORT OF THE SECOND AMENDMENT AND THE RIGHT OF THE PEOPLE TO KEEP AND BEAR ARMS

WHEREAS, the American people have retained to themselves the right to "keep and bear arms" – a right not subject to infringement by Congress as is memorialized in the Second Amendment to the United States Constitution, as part of United States Bill of Rights, ratified on December 15, 1791; and,

WHEREAS, a landmark decisions issued by the United States Supreme Court in <u>District of Columbia v. Heller</u> established that the Second Amendment protects an individual's right to possess a firearm from federal infringement unconnected with service in a militia, and to use that Arm for traditionally lawful purposes, such as, but not limited to, self-defense within the home; and

WHEREAS, the Court in <u>McDonald v. City of Chicago</u> established that the Fourteenth Amendment to the U.S. Constitution extended protection of the individual right to keep and bear arms to the several States under due process provisions of that Amendment; and

WHEREAS, according to Merriam Webster's New Collegiate Dictionary, the word "infringement" means "an encroachment or trespass on a right or privilege" – in other words a violation or constraint upon a right; and,

WHERAS, the right to Life, Liberty and the persuit of Happiness is held as an unalienable right granted to us by our Creator; we also hold the right to protect that Life, Liberty and Happiness as unalinenable right granted to us by our Creator.

WHERAS, elected officials, representaives and lawmakers are men and enpowered by men they are not the Creator and such do not have the power to override the rights granted to men by their Creator! Any infringment or restriction on those rights shall be seen by us as an afront to the Creator!

WHERAS, the Second Amendment to the Constitution is the means to protect the original Ten Amendments and the Constitution itself; we view any restriction or encrochment on the Second Amendment an encrochment on all the Amendments and the Constitution it's self.

WHEREAS, sadly, recent high profile events within our country have sparked discussions of gun-control at the local, state and federal levels, which have advanced proposed legislation which professes to address gun violence, while, in fact, infringes upon Second Amendment rights - (this has included numerous gun and ammunition control proposals, outright gun bans as well as registration schemes that would convert the right into a revocable privilege); and,

WHEREAS, the County of Siskiyou's economy is supported by family ranching, farming and natural resource businesses, and that the right to keep and bear Arms is fundamental to our right to protect our families, our property, our livestock, and our livelihood; and,

WHEREAS, as a "frontier county," hunting for food is a practice among many residents and, as a sport, hunting makes an important contribution to the local economy; and,

WHEREAS, the residents of this County respect the rights protected by the Second Amendment through the recognition and support of responsible firearm ownership, training and awareness; and,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Supervisors of the County of Siskiyou supports all discussions seeking new ideas to protect our citizens from violence but cannot abide by any order, provision, law or agency initiative that violates the protections of the Second Amendment.
